SUBSTANCES LIST (EPSL), TO BECOME EFFECTIVE 1 JANUARY 2017**

<b>SUBSTANCE NAME</b>	<b>CURRENT STATUS</b>	<b>PROPOSED EPSL CATEGORY</b>	<b>COMMENT</b>
<b>Adrenaline</b>	Banned Substance	Controlled Medication	Used for anaphylaxis, heart failure under general anaesthesia and in local anaesthetics
<b>AICAR</b>	Not Listed	Banned Substance	Substance with anabolic effects
<b>Andarine</b>	Not Listed	Banned Substance	Selective Androgen Receptor Modulator (SARM). Substance has androgenic effects
<b>Brinzolamide</b>	Banned Substance	Controlled Medication	Used in the treatment of glaucoma
<b>Calcium dobesilate</b>	Banned Substance	Controlled Medication	Used in the treatment of chronic venous insufficiency
<b>Cobalt</b>	Not Listed	Controlled Medication	Increases number of red blood cells and haemoglobin to enhance endurance. Cobalt will be listed as a threshold substance 100ng/ml in urine
<b>Dobutamine</b>	Banned Substance	Controlled Medication	Used for treating heart failure during general anaesthesia
<b>GW1516</b>	Not Listed	Banned Substance	Substance with anabolic effects
<b>Loperamide</b>	Banned Substance	Controlled Medication	Effective against diarrhoea

<b>Meldonium</b>	Not Listed	Banned Substance	Increases peripheral vascular failure and bloodflow to muscles
<b>Midazolam</b>	Banned Substance	Controlled Medication	Used in anaesthesia premedication and sedation in intensive care
<b>Naloxone</b>	Banned Substance	Controlled Medication	Drug used to counter the effects of opioids
<b>Norepinephrine</b>	Not Listed	Controlled Medication	Used for anaphylaxis, heart failure under general anaesthesia and in local anaesthetics
<b>Osterine</b>	Not Listed	Banned Substance	Selective Androgen Receptor Modulator (SARM). Substance has androgenic effects
<b>Phenylephrine</b>	Banned Substance	Controlled Medication	Used to treat hypotension and aid the diagnosis of grass sickness
<b>Thymosin</b>	Not Listed	Banned Substance	Peptide with anabolic and anti-inflammatory effects
<b>Tiletamine</b>	Banned Substance	Controlled Medication	Injectable general anaesthetic
<b>Zolazepam</b>	Banned Substance	Controlled Medication	Used in conjunction with tiletamine for general anaesthesia
